Your Positive Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) result

If you have taken a rapid antigen test (RAT) for COVID-19 and tested positive, under government regulations, it is **compulsory** to register your result online with WA Health.

You do this by either going to the link below or if you have received this notification electronically you can simply click on the link: https://datalibrary-rc.health.wa.gov.au/surveys/?s=WDLLNTW4RDX8AWPH

Once you have registered your result online with WA Health, they will contact you with information about isolation requirements.

The registration process will take approximately one minute and can be completed by yourself or another person on your behalf if you need assistance.

The registration process requires you to add the following information

- Date and time of the RAT test
- Personal details about your situation
- Phone number that they can contact you on

You will also be asked whether you have risk factors that mean you may require home monitoring support through the <u>WA COVID Care at Home</u> program.

Once you have completed the registration process, you <u>MUST</u> send a copy of the confirmation notice to the academy together with the notification advising of your isolation requirements to <u>admin@ahea.wa.edu.au</u>.

Only students who provide these copies will be allowed to participate in the missed class by ZOOM. All other students will be marked as absent and will be required to undertake a catch up class.

Definition of Close Contacts

Western Australia has also moved to the national definition of close contacts. This means that only household members and intimate partners of positive cases (or someone who has had more than four hours cumulative contact with a case in a residential setting without wearing a mask) need to isolate.

Students in schools will no longer be deemed close contacts under the government's revised definitions.
